





Whittier Narrows Rec Area Coordination Meeting Notes;

On short notice, Joel Chesler and I attended the user groups coordination meeting at the Whittier Narrows Admin Offices on Thursday, January 23. Louis Guerrero introduced Jaheel Dixon. I believe Jaheel will be working directly under David Jallo. In addition to Joel and me, Glenn Brand and Gilbert Lucero from the RC club attended.

The SGVRCL will be hosting several events throughout the year, starting with the Denis Lyon Memorial Racing Event March 28 and 29. This pylon racing event is well attended. As in the past, there will be practice sessions on Thursday and Friday. Control line fliers are strongly encouraged to stay on the south circle and the grass areas to create a margin of safety.

Gilbert told us that he has been approached by Lawrence Tougas about hosting a smaller version of AMA Expo West. The 3 day event is tentatively scheduled for November 6,7 and 8. The concept is there, but Gilbert and Lawrence have not made a formal presentation to WNRA, so the event has not been approved. Needless to say, this event is only a concept; but, at least it's on the table for development. There was a general agreement that signs need to be posted about the FAA registration requirement for all untethered craft. Glenn showed us a proposed sign for WNRA to post. Joel, rather pointedly insisted the sign include language making it perfectly clear that the FAA registration does not apply to control line flying. Glenn agreed to rethink the sign layout/language.

Louie stated that he wants to resume a more regular maintenance schedule for the model aircraft areas. **His current plan is close the fields from 8 AM to Noon during the 2nd Wednesday of each month.** His goal is to re-open the fields during the afternoon.

Louie and Jaheel are seriously thinking of holding future coordination meetings during the noon-time hour so all attendees have a chance of avoiding rush hour. That's an idea I'm liking alot.

The meeting adjourned about 5:45 pm.

Jan 2020 KOTRC Club Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order by President Mike Alurac at 6:55 PM
11 club members were present.

President Alurac introduced Greg Pawloski as the 2020 Vice President and Clint Brooks as the 2020 club Secretary.

Old Business

- A request/reminder to pay 2020 club dues was made by Pres Mike. A review of the club Christmas party and a recap of awards presented was discussed.
- As Warren Walker was present at the meeting, an overdue acknowledgement of his support of the 2019 Palmer contest as co-CD was made by Pres Mike with a certificate and a custom decorated coffee cup.
- A rain date for the 2019 1/2A stunt contest scheduled in the fall was requested by Larry Renger and John Wright, as the contest was rained out on the original date. No date was discussed or agreed to, and the motion for this remains an open issue for resolution.

- The recently reworked grass field area is starting to show new growth from the heavy rains earlier in the fall and early winter. The consensus was the field had improved dramatically in recent months and all were pleased with the attention being given by the park and members supporting the betterment of the area.

Show and Tell

- Larry Renger brought some Cox parts from the estate of Randy Hayden for distribution to the club. There was a quantity of TD .010, .020 and some other sizes small Cox engines, props, spanners and odds and ends that members present quickly sorted through. Larry also had an unusual and neat Randy Hayden model aptly name the “Ellipster”, which is a flat plate wing type model consisting of a joined wing and tail based on several ellipse planforms superimposed with the center cut out. Power appeared to be a Cox 1/2A engine, and was in beautiful condition. Larry also had a Mike Pratt designed Cox RTF 1/2A stunt model named the “Hyper Viper”, new in the unopened box. Similar to the foam Cox ME-109 1/2A stunter Larry designed for Cox, this one has never seen the light of day, and Larry is planning to bring it out and give it a new life.
- John Wright showed some Supertigre .51 engine cases and sleeves obtained at another modeling group meeting the previous evening. His plan for these is to rebuild and have as contest prizes or for sale through the club. He also had an aluminum sheet ‘Duramatic’ muffler he modified to have an exhaust port mounting from a cast muffler bonded to the formed aluminum sheet body using JB Weld epoxy. Main reason for this was to obtain a lightweight muffler for a McCoy .40 being planned for Ringmaster deployment.
- Joe Brownlee confessed to the error of CA gluing his clamping pressure rubber bands to a model assembly he was attempting to join. He had nothing to show, but was seeking sympathy and suggestions for how to remove the offending rubber material without damaging the wood model. Glue de-bonder, pure nitro,

scalpel and sanding were offered as solutions-we shall see where this leads.

- Warren Walker had his in-work painted “Humungous” O/T Stunt model on hand, and gave a really detailed process overview of how to mask for painting checkerboard trim. Already well underway for the checkerboard detailing, Warren went over the method of measuring and cutting masking tape squares and how to maintain alignment in applying them to the model. He had portions of the model already painted with checker board trim, and was going over other areas of the model for additional patterns. The result should be more than dazzling in the end and we can hardly wait to see the finished product. Having painted a checkerboard model many years ago, I have a lot of appreciation for the attention Warren is putting into this model. I prefer the iron on variety if it must be checkerboard, but now that we’ve seen his method perhaps more checkerboard paint trim will show up at the field.
- A club process issue was brought up by Paul Wescott concerning the need for conducting a clinic for stunt judges. There was a discussion about doing it, but no commitment or plan to establish one up was arrived at. This is probably something that should be considered under new business in 2020 to help grow the club technical strength. The club needs a focal point to establish this function.

Treasurer Report

Club Treasurer Mike Jones reviewed credits and debits for the month of December. He also reviewed the current balance and the bottom line is the club remains solvent heading into 2020. Some 2020 dues were collected at the meeting which included several members not present.

New Business

- 2020 club sponsored contests were brought up, and also supporting activities for the Fullerton Airport open house and the OC Imaginarium Fair. John Wright was going to put in for the

AMA sanction for the Palmer contest, and also the park fee to reserve the field for two days. John reviewed the 'new' process to reserve the field now involves making all reservations planned for the year up-front, including pre-payment of the fees. But he was told, you can only reserve for six months in advance. So typical SNAFU or mis-understanding at the park administration end on what is the desired procedure. All reservations for the flying field now require park supervisor 'approval' to keep it all under control. Support for the Airport Open House was agreed to as a similar operation performed in 2019. For the Imaginarium, it was decided not to volunteer for the event, and a decline to support if asked.

- A club member living in the San Diego area has asked for KOTRC to sanction him and at least four others (yet to be identified) to secure a public park flying site in City of Rancho Bernardo. The need to support is questionable with respect to understanding how many flyers could be organized into a 'club' to satisfy the park requirement, and also the liability of it. Joe Brownlee and Mike Jones were going to survey the area during visits to the area for other reasons, and will report back at a later date on their impressions of the proposed flying area.**
- The topic of the feed bag for the Palmer and Knights Joust events was brought up, with Warren Walker again championing the cause for being the chief cook and bottle washer for both of these. There was a tentative plan to purchase Little Caesar pizza for the Joust event from a nearby establishment, augmented with a tub o' soft drinks on ice to compliment it. This was met with enthusiasm by those present.**

Formal discussions ended and the meeting was adjourned at 8:40 by President Alurac.


